

2009 The John Sky Scholarship Program

Scholarship Overview

The Indigenous Early Intervention Alliance (IEIA) provides an educational scholarship in the name of **John Sky** to help a Bad River tribal member attend the college or technical school of their choice. John Sky was a full-blooded Chippewa Native American who lived on the Bad River Reservation.

Scholarship Requirements

The John Sky Scholarship will be given to a person who is accepted into or registered in a University of Wisconsin systems college or technical college and is working toward a college diploma or certificate. The scholarship is a one-time award of \$750. The nominee must be a Bad River Tribal member and preferably residing on the reservation at the time of application. The recipient and non-awardees are encouraged to reapply in the following year (fall 2010).

Please submit the following by **August 31, 2009** (late or emailed applications will not be reviewed): Letter of application, your name, contact information, college major, academic level (freshman, sophomore, graduate student, etc.), and plans following graduation from college to:
